Dear colleagues,

It gives us great pleasure to welcome you to the Panhellenic Congress on Economics and Health Policy, focusing on "COVID-19 pandemic: The aftermath" to be held this year online.

The Hellenic Society of Health Economics and Policy (EEEOPY) and the Institute for Health Economics (i-hecon) are the organisers of the Panhellenic Congress on Economics and Health Policy, which is -admittedly- the largest and most significant conference in the field of health sciences and health services research with a remarkable impact on the country's health policies.

Other scientific agencies and scientific societies provide scientific support to the Congress, such as the Hellenic Society for Healthcare Services Administration (EEDYY), Health Policy Institute, the Lab-HTA – University of West Attica, eHealth Forum, the Hellenic Society of eHealth Services and Education (EEMEPY), EIP on AHA – Greek Network, and HL7 Hellas.

The COVID-19 pandemic has unprecedented ramifications affecting health, the society, and the economy. Its rapid spread and the difficulty of governments and public authorities in managing it successfully, highlight unforeseen issues in need of immediate intervention in the healthcare sector, while at the same time making imperative the search for effective answers to meet the challenges of the economy and society at large.

The 2021 Panhellenic Congress on Economics and Health Policy shall be focusing on the data and challenges brought forward during the pandemic in pursuit of a roadmap to exit the current crisis. It aspires to analyse the experiences collected and lessons learned from epidemiology and public health; healthcare safety; the implications for health and the society; mental health; the need for social support extended to minorities and special populations; lastly, to investigate opportunities such as innovation and digital technology for redesigning and reconstructing the health system. The government has acknowledged the gravity of the problems and is committed to tackling them -but are the solutions feasible? The questions raised are numerous -like, for instance: Is access to health services affected? Is the percentage of the population with unmet needs increasing? Are there consequences for chronic patients? Is the viability of the country's healthcare sector in doubt? What are the new priorities in primary healthcare? Are there obstacles in adopting innovation? What are the uncertainty management policies? What are the implications for national policies on medicines or even health services?

The long-standing economic and social crisis of recent years has affected the structures, cohesion and quality of the health system services. At a time of reconstruction and development efforts, the COVID-19 pandemic makes it imperative to change priorities in our shared efforts.

All health sector stakeholders, as well as healthcare professionals, social, economic, and humanitarian studies scientists, public officials, representatives of scientific agencies and universities are invited -just like every year- to partake in the scientific organisation and support of the Congress, but also to actively participate in its works, albeit remotely this time.
